#### Storytime (with cookies!)


In this interactive storytime, children will have the chance to decorate cookies with a master baker.

# Peoria Reads! The Library Book - Special Interview July 12

Each year, we feature an important book through our annual Peoria Reads! one city, one book project. Since 2021 is the 20th year of Peoria Reads!, we chose a book particularly near and dear to our hearts — *The Library Book* by Susan Orlean.

In *The Library Book*, Orlean chronicles the 1986 suspicious and destructive fire at the Los Angeles Public Library, as well as its aftermath, to highlight the crucial role libraries play in our personal lives and our communities. From the humble beginnings of libraries to their current status as a cornerstone of national identity, Orlean brings libraries – even the charred remains of one – to life. Part history. Part mystery. All heart.

We have hosted several program throughout the year related to the book, but our final program on Monday, July 12 is particularly special.

Peoria Public Library Deputy Director Roberta Koscielski will interview Glen Creason of the Los Angeles Public Library. Creason is one of the remaining few librarians who was on staff 35 years ago at the time of the fire who remains at the library today.
