Celebrate the 10th Anniversary of Lincoln Branch's Transformation

Peoria Public Library's Lincoln Branch will celebrate the 10th anniversary of an expansion that more than tripled the size of Peoria's only Carnegie library with an open house on Friday, Dec. 10.

Join us from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Dec. 10 for light refreshments and recognition from library and community officials.

"Each of our locations brings something special to our community," notes Peoria Public Library Executive Director Randall Yelverton, "Lincoln Branch is the only other location outside of Main Library with a dedicated computer lab, and our staff has brought enviable STEM programming to the city's South Side because of it." Added Yelverton: "Thanks to partnerships with our schools and area nonprofits such as the Boys & Girls Club and more, Lincoln Branch staff has built strong connections with the children and teens in this area. They're like family."

Built in 1910, Lincoln Branch is Peoria's only Andrew Carnegie library. The addition in 2010, part of a \$28 million modernization effort across Peoria's entire library system, expanded its footprint from 4,570 square feet to 16,300 square feet. The expansion "didn't change how we did things, but it did make things more accessible, and it allowed us to reach more people," notes Lincoln Branch manager Cynthia Smith.
