Request for Proposals, Make Art Your Superpower through Storytelling

Background/Introduction:

Our Mission: The Peoria Public Library will provide all residents books, other printed materials, new technologies, and programs that stimulate personal intellectual growth and development and provide a satisfying experience that nurtures a love of reading and the joy of discovery.

As a part of the PPL mission, the McClure Branch seeks to establish an Artist in Residence program, funded through Delta Kappa Gamma Nu Chapter's Lambda State Foundation for Educational Studies. The Artist in Residence will hold office hours at the McClure Branch, will teach a class for interested students at McClure, and will hold a week-long class for community youth.

This opportunity is available to Peoria-area artists.

Project Goals and Scope of Services: The Artist in Residence Program will establish an opportunity to create an artist in residence at the McClure Branch of Peoria Public Library. The artist in residence will informally teach library visitors during "office hours" at the branch, provide formal learning in a monthly library program open to students of all ages, and work closely with a community organization that serves young people to formally teach kids/teens in the community.

For the Spring 2023 session, we will work with a writer and a visual artist who will teach students, helping to create a book for publication and circulation at the Peoria Public Library.

DKG Nu Chapter/PPL responsibilities

- Ensure that grant money is spent according to the grant requirements
- Review proposals and select artist(s)
- Coordinate with local organizations (East Bluff Community Center; Boys and Girls Club; Peoria High School, etc)
- Provide materials
- Display art at library
- Provide physical space for participants
- Manage photo rights for participants
- Create, gather, and compile program evaluations from participants

Artist responsibilities

- Provide a program proposal to the DKG/library committee
- Provide "office hours" at the library one Saturday/month (2 hours)
- Plan and provide class/lecture at the library – one evening/month (2 hours, + prep time)
- Plan and provide week-long, youth focused lessons on their art – one week/month (5 hours, + prep time)

Artist pay: covers 10 hours/month @\$30/hour, so Artist Stipend will be \$300 per month, with all materials paid for by the grant.
